The Florida House and Senate released their initial budgets last Friday (2/4/22). Summaries of the House and Senate budgets can be found [here](#) and [here](#).

The House recommended \$105.3 billion in spending, an increase of 3.6% over the current fiscal year. The Senate came in at 108.6 billion in spending.

After releasing their budget, both the House and Senate passed their budget on Wednesday through their Appropriation Committees. The Chambers are set to hold a floor vote on the budgets next week. The budget must be passed by the end of session and must be balanced.

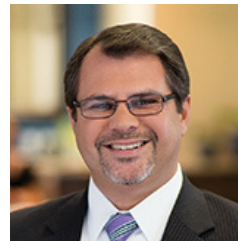

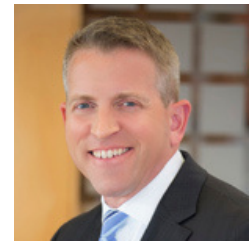
